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General Information

Am I Eligible

Colby College requires all registered full-time students to have health insurance coverage, either through this Student Health Insurance Plan or through another individual or family plan. Students are automatically enrolled in and billed for the Student Health Insurance Plan unless proof of comparable coverage is provided by completing the online waiver.

All full-time international students or Language Assistant students are required to have health insurance coverage and will be automatically enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plan and the Premium will be added to the student's tuition fees.

Dependents

Dependents are not eligible.

Eligibility for Late Enrollment -

Qualifying Life Event Students who successfully waive the Colby College Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP) and then subsequently experience an involuntary loss of health insurance coverage due to a Qualifying Life Event (Examples: job change/loss, age out) are given an opportunity to enroll in the SHIP for the remainder of the plan year. The enrollment window is within 60 days of the loss of coverage. Students would reach out to Collyn Baeder, Director of Student Health and Wellness, at cbaeder@colby.edu to request enrollment.

How Do I Waive/Enroll??

To Waive/Enroll:

All registered full-time domestic undergraduate students will need to take action every school year to either **Waive** the Colby Student Health Insurance Plan or **Enroll** by the deadline.

Students who wish to have the expense for this coverage removed from the College charges may do so by providing other insurance Information online*. Students must verify that they have other adequate insurance coverage in order to waive automatic enrollment in the Student Health Insurance Plan. The deadline to enroll in or waive coverage is August 1, 2024. For those students beginning in the Spring Term, the deadline to enroll in or waive coverage is January 1, 2025. Students who complete the waiver by August 1, 2024 do not need to complete the waiver again for January. No waivers will be accepted after the deadline.

*(If you are a non-US student looking to waive coverage because you have US-based insurance that you feel is comparable to the required policy, please reach out to SFS at sfs@colby.edu for next steps. Also, please note, Travel coverage from your home country is not considered comparable coverage.)

Next select the button to Waive or Enroll. Students will be prompted to log into their existing Wellfleet Account. If you do not have a Wellfleet account, select "Create an Account", and proceed.

Students requesting to waive will need to answer a few questions and upload a copy of the front and back of their current insurance ID card. Wellfleet will review the information based on what has been submitted. Once the waiver is submitted, you will receive an email and/or text message (if selected) regarding your waiver status.
